URINE Collection Protocol

CLEAN CATCH MIDSTREAM SPECIMENS:

FEMALES:

- 1. Wash hands thoroughly with soap and water.
- 2. Take lid off container; DO NOT TOUCH INSIDE OF CONTAINER OR LID.
- 3. Open two (2) castile soap towelettes.
- 4. Separate the skin folds around the urinary opening with thumb and forefinger of one hand and keep them separated.
- 5. Wash the urinary opening from front to back with towelette; discard towelette.
- 6. Repeat with second towelette using downward strokes only and discard.
- 7. Keeping the skin folds separated; begin to urinate into the toilet.
- 8. Once a steady stream is established for a few seconds, move container into path of urine flow and collect urine into cup.
- 9. DO NOT FILL CONTAINER MORE THAN HALF-FULL.
- 10. When finished, screw lid onto the container tightly. Wash hands.
- 11. Deliver to laboratory as soon as practical; KEEP SPECIMEN REFRIGERATED OR ON ICE until delivered.
- 12. Indicate if patient is menstruating.

MALES:

- 1. Wash hands thoroughly with soap and water.
- 2. Take lid off container; DO NOT TOUCH INSIDE OF CONTAINER OR LID.
- 3. Open two (2) castile soap towelettes.
- 4. If foreskin present, completely retract foreskin with one hand and keep it retracted during cleaning and urine collection.
- 5. Clean head of penis with towelette and discard; repeat with second towelette.
- 6. Begin to urinate into the toilet.
- 7. Once a steady stream is established for a few seconds, move container into path of urine flow and collect urine into cup.
- 8. DO NOT FILL CONTAINER MORE THAN HALF-FULL.
- 9. When finished, screw lid on to container tightly. Wash hands.
- 10. Deliver to laboratory as soon as practical; KEEP SPECIMEN REFRIGERATED OR ON ICE until delivered.

CATHETERIZED, SUPRAPUBIC ASPIRATES, OR SURGICALLY OBTAINED SPECIMENS:

- 1. Aseptically collect urine according to applicable nursing/surgical procedure.
- 2. Submit in sterile urine cup; DO NOT FILL SPECIMEN CONTAINER MORE THAN HALF FULL.
- 3. Deliver to laboratory as soon as practical; KEEP SPECIMEN REFRIGERATED OR ON ICE until delivered.
- 4. Indicate type of specimen (straight cath, foley, cytoscopic, etc.).
- 5. Note if female patient is menstruating.

URINE, 24-HOUR Collection Protocol

- 1. Obtain a 24-hour urine container. Label clearly with patient's name.
- 2. Patient should empty bladder completely into the toilet after getting up the first morning. Record time and date on container.
- 3. All subsequent urine specimens should be poured into the 24-hour urine container INCLUDING THE FIRST SPECIMEN COLLECTED AFTER GETTING UP THE FOLLOWING DAY. Record time and date on container.
- 4. Any clean container may be used to pour the specimen into the 24-hour container.
- 5. REFRIGERATE the 24-hour urine collection container until collection is complete.
- 6. Bring to the laboratory as soon after collection as possible.
